Next January, governments around the world will meet in Nairobi, Kenya to discuss the future of agriculture. This is a unique opportunity to influence the direction of global for coming agriculture the generation. According to Greenpeace. governments will either "promote failed. а unsustainable model of industrial agriculture backed with toxic pesticides and uncontrolled genetically engineered crops, or support organic and sustainable farming practices."

Jointly sponsored by the UN and the World Bank, the <u>draft report</u> of International Assessment of Agricultural Science and Technology for Development is now accepting comments **until October 22nd**. Greenpeace is asking you to take a
